The 65th Infantry was the only segregated military division with Puerto Ricans and later other Spanish-speakers, including Mexican Americans, were included in this division. The 65th regiment is the last segregated Army unit in history of the U.S. that served during all global wars of the 20th century and the last unit to fight with fixed bayonets against a division of Communist China during the Korean War. On April 13, 2016 President Obama signed the bill honoring the 65th Infantry with the medal. In January 2021 congress named April 13th as the **National Borinqueneers Day!**
